At this time of year we update our church membership list, which is also known as the 'Electoral Roll'. The General Data Protection Regulations also require us to ask you if we can keep your personal contact information and use it for our mission and pastoral care.

So this form serves two purposes:

- **to invite you to join the membership of our church; and**
- **to request explicit consent from you to store and use your personal information to further the mission and pastoral care of our church**

Whether you have been a part of our church for 6 months or 60+ years it will be my privilege to worship alongside you and to work with you in the mission of our church for the glory of God. We stand together on the verge of a very exciting future in Bembridge and I hope that you feel that this is your spiritual home.

Being on the Electoral Roll has several important benefits:

On an official level, being on the Electoral Roll gives you the right to vote at our Annual General Meeting (this year being held after church at 11:45am on Sunday 16th May at Holy Trinity, Bembridge), as well as the right to use our church for baptisms, marriages and funerals.

However, more importantly, unofficially, being on the Electoral Roll is a declaration of your desire to belong to our church family and partner with us in our church's mission. It therefore gives you a voice in shaping our priorities and enables you to support the ministries of our church.

Giving consent for us to use your personal information will allow the leadership to contact you to arrange a visit or to send you information such as up-coming events, critical notices or other important information. You can unsubscribe at any time. We will always keep this information safe and we will never share it with anyone or for any other purpose than that which we have stated.

We hope that Holy Trinity will help you grow in love to know and serve our God, and we invite you to partner with us as we build up our church community and reach out to our village and beyond with love in action.
